Dear Ones at Home

I will write a few lines this evening in answer to your last letter. I put on my undershirts Monday and wore my overcoat first time yesterday. I was awful damp taking my papers last night because it rained most of the time and pretty hard too. Mr Silver the boy who has the wood job at the college has not come yet. I have a job of piling in wood for an instructor in the college Miss Hill who is also my advisor. it will be worth about \$50. I got packages last night and was glad to have them. I have not seen Mr McPain yet. How is Vernal by this time? Tell Glenn I would like to hear from him and about his hunting.

Have you got the your wood
sawed and in the shed. I would
like to have the grades Miss
Redfield said she would send to
you. I like the college fine and
there are lots of nice people in
this town. I must go now with
my paper and will write more
when I get back.

Well it is twenty minutes
till nine and I have just got
back. The folks have all gone
to the ^{convention} Ethel and she
has gone to bed so I am alone.
Have you heard from your
piece about Oregon yet
papa. We have had lots of
watermelons this we went
of into the country with
an other man, who took us
the melon patch and sack

were half the meters. We got
fifty for half a dollar and so
had twenty five ourselves.
about eight inches long and
six inches through. The clouds
have all passed away and
it is very clear out now.
I would like to get a letter
from Vernal too. How is Papa's
health? Has Byron started to
college yet? How is Snip. I have
thirty eight papers to deliver
now, 23 telegrams and 10 journals.
I have told enough for this
time so I will close.
