

At Home Aug 14 1905-

Dear Mama

Gleasons going over there must have paralyzed you or so added to your work that you had not time to write. I called at the office Saturday AM and there was no letter so I do not get one this morning unless you sent by some excursionists yesterday.

Cliff & I got home from Froman's Sat noon. I found a letter here from Herman Walker telling that he & wife were going out to F.G. Friday and to return Sat & she would then come to Albany Sunday and I would find her at the Revere House. I tried to get word by phone to Leo's Sat PM but he had no phone, and they waited so long to get a messenger that I told Albany office to let it go. For I did not believe the word would get there in time, I was going to tell Henry

That you had not returned from the sea side.

I went to Church yesterday AM, then came by the Revere House, she was not there, so I started for Pas and met her near Polston's corner, and we both went to Pas. Ma had invited me to dinner before meeting. Doc & Fessa, Magan & Ellen were there, they were through dinner when we got there for so took a ride on to go up to Irving Lane Co to see some of his people. Ma set us out a cold dinner but we enjoyed it.

Nellie came home with me & will stay here to rest up two or three days. She knew you had gone to Newport but thought you might have returned, and so expected to do the house work for you - while here. One reason for her coming was to get help for her rheumatism. Was expecting to go to Goddardville but I advised her to go to Landon Lane Co

which she expects to do. Will go in a day
or two while weather is good, and visit you
and others when she returns.

She says for you not to come home on her
account. Lissa went home with Ellen
last night. She is considerable better but
has still to walk with crutches.

Ellen is going to the Fair next Saturday.

Don't know how long Lissa will stay
up here. No other spring seems to come

for Clifford so he'll help me this week.

It is cloudy this morning and misted a little.

Don't expect rain till last of the month.

I am going in to town to get Nellie's quip at
depot and some retas to live on.

I suppose Glen keeps you in fish. If he is
too much of a burden have him come home.

Well I don't think of anything more. May
add a little in town. Nellie weighs 227^{lb}

I brought her out in the buggy OK.

I took the springs off of Cliff's bed. Found
sheets &c in bureau, and bed clothes

in box up stairs, I got breakfast -
this morning. Will have to get some
coffee. No cream as cows are dry.
It's funny, Thess P O at Sherman's
is London and Nellie will go to
London too.

Lissa is like me she thinks you
had better stay until cooler weather
here. It may come now though no
rain to speak of.
