not yet arrived. Perhaps I forgot
to write to you, that you left
your umbrella in the house, here,
instead of putting it into the stage.

The weather is somewhat colder
though not nearly so severe as it
was before we left.

We heard from James that
he reached home in about 40 hours
after leaving us; but perhaps you
have heard from him. He sent
regards to you. The stage has
