

Dayton June 27 1867

Dear Father

I was rather expecting  
to see you and mother this week as I thought  
you would come down from Solon Husway  
but Mr Brown told me last night that you  
stayed all night at his house last week. I  
have just written to Mr Vaughn in regard  
to that note & told him you had got the money  
from me & you expected to pay it. Though you  
would probably like the use of it a year longer  
Have you sold that land to Mr Marsh yet  
I wish you could sell mine, as I would like  
the money to use, I think I can do better with  
it than I ever can with the land at the Grove

I dont ever expect to go back there  
to live, now. I've got away. I think I'll  
stay away. but Goodell says he is out one  
barrell of flour, in consequence of my getting  
five bush of wheat chopped, so you will either  
have to pay him for a barrell of flour or let  
him have five bush of wheat, or any other  
way you are a mind to settle it. We are all  
pretty well. Selby is much better than he  
was last week.
