They are down to having only 1 person in attendance in the lobby of the hotel during all hours and it is not known if or when the staff will be replaced.

Daily buses out of the Ranch now carry approximately 26 persons that are leaving the Ranch.

Sergeant Aveline advised that he had spoken to Mr. Herb Koenig, court appointed trustee for Rajneeshpuram, and that Mr. Koenig said the trustees, attorneys and commune members had all signed the papers for sale of remained equipment at the Ranch. That there is plenty of money to settle debts at the Ranch and that the trustees expect to be gone from the Ranch is approximately 1 week.

Mr. Koenig also advised that per the court order, the population at the Ranch will be down to 100 caretakers and approximately 20 corporation personnel by the date ordered by the court. It is expected that the caretakers and corporation personnel will remain on the ranch for 2 months to settle all business.
