then come back I believe and thresh Sam's grain on the Mr. Roy
and Cowlers places. Sam cut most of his grain to thresh and so
may want to buy hay. Oh my had hot it does keep, day after day
It has clouded up some this afternoon, and it may turn cooler
soon. Well its ^{after} 9 o'clock and I must close. It makes it seem less
lonesome since I have made up my mind to go down in October. Its a
month tomorrow since we left Albany. Six weeks more and I will
be on my way home I hope. I would like to be with you tonight.
I hope Ma will get her wanted health again; Good night, and
