Meeting was called to order by acting chairman Miss Davies for the purpose of reading and discussing the Constitution and By Laws of the Association. The sections of the Constitution and By Laws <sup>were adopted</sup> as follows: Name adopted as read. Object of Association adopted as read. Section of Constitution pertaining to officers and their duties passed. Article concerning election of officers was adopted. Duties of proctors adopted as revised. Articles concerning meetings, twenty-five cent tax and amendments were adopted as read. By Laws: Officers oath and membership agreement article was adopted moved and passed that the rule regarding study and quiet hours be adopted, also article concerning musical instruments and soft shoes. Articles on reception hours and rules, and also providing for time in house of residence were passed. Rules concerning leave of absence were accepted, also the rule about consulting dean or matron before visiting out of the hall, or visits to doctor. moved and carried that the rule concerning guests be adopted subject to change.



Rules concerning order of rooms, absence from meals were passed. The rule regarding the lights was adopted as revised. Rules about penalties, fines for absences from meetings, and registering before leaving the house were passed. The article on amendments to the By Laws was passed. As there was no further business the meeting was adjourned.
