July 14 1896

Dear Mama

I did not hear from Pineville today so I am not going in the morning. There is no mail until next Saturday, so unless some of the bondsmen come over I will stay till then. I may go out Sunday morning as far as Simnasho. I am not a caring how long I stay. It was only because I felt that I was not making enough for the bondsmen to justify them to keep me that I wanted to go. I have notified them and if they fail to send me money or any word they must stand the expense. I got track of some property today and wanted to stay longer any way until I can secure it on my papers. Every day here means much more than if I were at home so I know you will not grieve very much. The weather is very warm and sultry. 70^o today. It is nearly dark in the office

so I will not write any more. God bless &
I took supper tonight at Dr Richards in an-
ticipation that I would leave in the morning.
We all think Major is terrible cranky,
though of course he is pettish on account of
his illness. I don't think I would like to be under
him, even when he was well. I think he will
not stay here many months. He's worse than
Farber in some things. He's not got religion
enough to hurt him. I expect to treat him
the same right along, and not mind his
fault finding.
