

A Preparation for a world outside the classroom requires strength characterized by Pacific's distinguished faculty and the resources available to students throughout our university. As a fully accredited, independent and coeducational institution, Pacific is for students seeking a quality, small college experience. Our admission is selective. Because Pacific is a complex university, not just a liberal arts college, our students develop their personal and professional abilities in a format offering both general and specialized studies. Located 25 miles west of Portland, Oregon's largest city and cultural center, Pacific boasts of a spectacular landscape and a wealth of recreational resources. To the 1,100 students comprising our student body, Pacific University is home.

channels of a vast, ever-changing world. It is a voyage that dares you to accept challenge and to take risks. It is the beginning of a lifelong voyage of even greater adventure. • Pacific's distinguished faculty, superb facilities and selectively admitted student body create a campus of great creativity. It is directional. It is inspirational. As a student at Pacific, you will be encouraged to chart your own course. Acknowledge the options which are yours for the choosing. Decide upon the field of study which best suits your individual career goals. • At Pacific, academic studies in the liberal arts. sciences and professional fields are enhanced by special programs and extracurricular activities. The university subscribes to a philosophy that quality education is essential-that governing must include participation by those governed and that all participants should share in the work. As a result, Pacific students participate. They shape the very world in which they live and work.







Pacific University is composed of two colleges—the College of Arts and Sciences and the College of Optometry. Each is enhanced by

specialized programs and advanced studies for master's degrees. Pre-professional programs in both colleges are designed to take you through a total, well-balanced curriculum channeled toward specific, professional goals. • Using a 7-7-3 academic calendar, the Pacific course of study is as personal as it is intense. Both semesters are divided into three terms-two seven-week terms and one three-week term. Students take two academic courses during the seven-week terms and one academic course during the three-week term. The College of Arts and Sciences: Perhaps the broadest curriculum provided in a liberal arts college is this area which examines the humanities, sciences and social sciences. Major programs leading to the B.A. or B.S. degree are offered in the following fields:


Applied Science (emphases available in Computer Science, Electronic Science, Engineering, Environmental Science, Integrated Science and Medical Technology), Art, Biology, Business Administration, Chemistry, Communication Disorders, Computer Science, Coordinated Studies in Humanities, Elementary Education, English, Fine Arts, History, Mathematics, Modern Languages, Music, Occupational Therapy, Philosophy, Physical Education, Physics, Political Science, Psychology, Religion, Secondary Education certification in Art, Biology, Communication Disorders, English, French, German, Health Education (combined endorsement only), Integrated Science, Mathematics, Music,

Reading (combined endorsement only), Spanish, Social Studies (Secondary Education students only), Social Work, Sociology, Telecommunications and Visual Science. A major program leading to the B.M. degree is offered in Music.

The College of Optometry: As one of only 14 accredited schools or colleges of optometry in the nation and the only program of its kind on an independent university campus, Pacific's College of Optometry has a very fine reputation. With on-campus and clinical facilities, the college prides itself in a faculty of national distinction. The course of study leads to a Doctor of Optometry degree. Pre-Professional Programs: Pacific's pre-professional programs are designed to help students in the health professions, applied sciences, law and theology. Pre-professional programs include law, theology, health professions (medicine, medical technology, occupational therapy, optometry, pharmacy and physical therapy) and applied sciences (3-2) engineering and electronic science).

Advanced Education: Pacific University offers advanced degrees in the following

Education: Master of Arts in Teaching (M.A.T.) in Art, French, (Långuage Arts, and Spanish. Master of Science in Teaching (M.S.T.) in Biology, Integated Science, Mathematics, Physical Education and Social Studies. • Optometry: Master of Science in Physiological Optics. (A management track in optometry is also offered.) Master of Education in Visual Function in Learning, certification in Hospital Optometry and certification in Rehabilitative Optometry. • Computer Science and Electronic Science: Master of Science (M.S.) in conjunction with the Oregon Graduate Center. Physical Therapy: Master of Science in Physical Therapy.





Goals. Priorities. Incentives. What determines the course of your Pacific passage is your willingness to look ahead, to determine

what route will best enhance your voyage, to find the passageway that will take you where you want to go. The special programs offered to you through Pacific University are directions which can lead you beyond your expectations. Set your sights high. Explore the Pacific Passageways. Studies Abroad: Eligible sophomores; juniors and seniors are encouraged to spend one semester or full year abroad. The university, in cooperation with Central College of Pella, Iowa, sends students to overseas study centers located in England, France, Germany, Austria, Spain, and Wales. Foreign Language majors are required to spend at least one semester studying in a country outside the U.S. University Honors Program: Superior academic work is recognized at Pacific with this special program. Eligible freshmen and sophomores apply, and those selected receive special academic privileges and are asked to participate in interdisciplinary seminars. Career Internships: Interested juniors and seniors work in environments related to their academic major and corresponding career goals. In a period ranging from seven weeks to a full academic year, students observe and participate with professionals

in their day-to-day operations. 3-2 Engineering and Electronic Science: Pacific's Engineering and Applied Science programs work in cooperation with four other engineering colleges: Georgia Institute of Technology, Oregon State University, Washington State University and Washington University in St. Louis. These fiveyear programs incorporate three years of study at Pacific and two years at one of the above schools. With the Oregon Graduate Center, Pacific offers a program in the rapidly expanding field of Electronic Science. Outdoor Field Studies: The Malheur Field Station, Pacific's outdoor study center, is located on the western edge of the Malheur National Wildlife Refuge in the high country of Central Oregon. The station is used for field study during the school year and for summer courses on topics ranging from ecology to outdoor survival and wildlife illustration.








The wealth of Pacific University is in its resources. Its human resources—students and faculty. Its physical resources—made posical resou






Involve yourself in a campus life with friends and colleagues of nearly every conceivable background. Extend your living experi-

ences to the great outdoors where mountains, beaches and extraordinary vistas are waiting to be discovered. The quality of life is something special at Pacific. • Pacific's 55-acre campus is located in the rural community of Forest Grove, Oregon, 25 miles west of Portland. You'll find it to be a handsome blend of old and new buildings, a reflection of our historic beginnings and our commitment to growth. Our three campus residence halls provide a home base as well as a hub of activity for Pacific men and women. Meals are served in the commons located in the University Center. • What surrounds the Pacific campus is a vast expanse of green countryside, bordered by the Oregon Coastal Range. Beyond this range is the 300-mile stretch of Oregon coast. The adventures are plenty and yours to explore. Hike, snow ski, beachcomb, camp, bicycle—enjoy the possibilities in a climate usually found to be temperate in fall, winter and spring while comfortably sunny in summer. • Oregon's spectacular natural resources are prime for the recreational pursuits of Pacific University students. Our surroundings establish the prevailing attitude that if one works hard academically,

the reward will be that time spent in pursuit of other challenges—those native to the terrain.








Pacific University offers students adventures and encounters outside the classroom, too. Choose from a host of professional and

recreational interest groups, becoming involved as much or as little as your time permits. Meet students of both common and diverse interests. Special events and activities reign throughout the year as well. Student Groups: There are several organizations at Pacific from which programs have evolved. For instance: Student Services encompasses such organizations as governance, programming and theatre. Special interest organizations are represented by our Hawaiian Club, International Students, Politics and Law Forum. Recreation includes intramurals, handball, outdoor programs, etc. Professional organizations are directed by the Student Optometric Association, Physical Therapy majors, Therapeutic Recreation majors and others. Media organizations include the university newspaper, yearbook, literary magazine and radio station. Athletics: Pacific offers 10 intercollegiate sports for men and eight for women. • Men's include: baseball, basketball, football, golf, soccer, swimming, tennis, track and wrestling. As a member of the Northwest Conference, Pacific competes with Lewis and Clark, Linfield, Pacific Lutheran, Whitman, Whitworth and Willamette. •

Women's intercollegiate sports include: basketball, soccer, softball, swimming, tennis, track and volleyball. Women compete in the Women's Conference of Independent Colleges: George Fox, Lewis and Clark, Linfield, Pacific Lutheran and Willamette. Music Ensembles: The Pacific University Community Orchestra, the University Jazz Workshop, the University Choir, the Pacific University Band and several chamber ensembles are open to our musically inclined students. Private instruction is also available in voice and most instruments.







It is our responsibility to you, the entering student, to provide the finest possible academic community. For this reason, we are selec-

tive in our admissions. The following will give you the criteria on which we base your admission. Requirements for Freshmen: College preparatory work, SAT or ACT test scores, counselor recommendation and optional student interview or other student-submitted information are the basic evaluative materials needed to determine the individual's potential for successful study at the college level. Nearly all Pacific students are ranked in the upperhalf of their high school class and have strong, supporting recommendations. Transfer Students: Applicants should have a 2.0 grade point average for all collegelevel work to be considered for admission. Strength of the academic program is given strong consideration. Transfer students receive full credit for liberal arts courses equivalent to Pacific courses completed with a grade of C or higher. Test scores are required of all transfer students with less than 30 semester hours of credit. Rolling Admissions: Pacific University considers applications as they are completed, beginning November 1 of each year and continuing through the school year. Interested students are encouraged to apply early. Optometry, Physical Therapy, and

Occupational Therapy Applicants: Applicants to these professional programs should contact the office of admission for application packets. Deadline for application to the College of Optometry is December 15. Deadline for application to the professional Physical Therapy program is January 5. Deadline for application to the Occupational Therapy program is January 15. Visits: Tour our campus. Attend classes. Meet with Pacific students. Spend an evening in one of our residence halls. Pacific University welyou our campus life. • The admissions office provides one night's lodging and a full day's meals for all visiting students. With adequate notice, longer stays can be provided at nominal cost. Give us a call and we'll help make all the arrangements.

*There are additional charges for professional students (occupational therapy, optometry and physical therapy) and for those who take private musiclessons. Pacific's Financial Aid Office administers approximately \$4 million in financial aid funds annually. Approximately 75% of the enrolled students receive aid and are involved in campus work study programs. • All students applying for financial aid should submit a Financial Aid Form to the College Scholarship Service as soon as possible after January 1, requesting that a copy be sent to Pacific. The form may be obtained from any secondary school or community college counselor or from the Financial Aid Office at Pacific. In addition, transfer students must complete a

Financial Aid Transcript for each college or university formerly attended. Financial Aid Transcripts may be obtained by contacting the Financial Aid Office. • Analysis of the financial information submitted will indicate how much an applicant's family can be expected to contribute toward the cost of one year in school. The financial aid resources of the university will be used to help make up the difference between the family contribution recommended by the College Scholarship Service and the cost of a year's attendance at Pacific. • Students must apply each year for renewal of their financial aid. The university will continue assistance as long as need continues and the student maintains a satisfactory academic record.
