

That portion of your book, The Goose Is Out, concerning Yogi Bhajan has just been brought to my attention.

Your references to him on pages 165 and 166 contain some serious factual errors which expose Yogi Bhajan to injury.

First, Yogi Bhajan was never "just a porter" or "a poor porter." He worked at the Delhi Airport as a Customs Officer.

More importantly, Yogi Bhajan's motivation to come to America was based on his desire to serve mankind and had nothing to do with Muktananda. In fact Yogi Bhajan moved to the United States before Muktananda ever brought any group of Americans to India.
