Brown - Met with Margaret Hallock re: Comparable Worth.
Good meeting and all involved feel much better.

Fred Segrest has been speaking to Chambers of Commerce in
Portland area. Told those in attendance "what they wanted
to hear." Also, spoke in Medford. Going very well.
Brown will get copy of remarks to us.

Grant - Trying to get a handle on excess hospital beds in
Portland area. University hospital unilaterally establish
a renal facility in Beaverton area without a review, etc.
Grant calling to their attention.

Miller - Traveled state for Ballot Measure 2. Expect failure.
Observed strong relationships with local government.

Also viewed Harney County problem.

Post - Chancellor in Portland at Oregon Graduate Center.
Penk case is being reviewed at Judge Frye's instruction
for settlement. Finding open meetings law to be detriment
to recruiting process. Higher Ed may make some recommenda-
tions to Governor.

Duncan - Task forces official reports will be released
this coming Friday. Governor's old bills, SB 1 and SB 72
in 1972, have been incorporated.

Hegstrom - Feds have left Fairview. Focused mostly on staffing.
We show as one of the lowest (staff to patient ratio) in
the country. Leo has done analysis that shows "too many
chiefs and not enough Indians."

Yunker - State of Washington reviewing the next 2 days our
DHR to find out how we are keeping the "lid on."
