

Warm Springs Agency Or  
Sept 6 1890

Dear Mary

I have not time to write much this morning. I was routing our Pas papers until 10 o'clock. Benman got back on mail back yesterday. They bought a young lady about 14 I should guess to work for them. Irene came down too, and went to Mr Luckey. Mr L said to me no one invited her there. The bids were opened last evening. Mr Corsles is the lowest - but his sample is not as good as Mr Davis. We think Mr Luckey feels bound to give it to Mr C. We are going to try and get him to refer the matter to the Commissioner, sending the two samples of flour. I heard Mrs Starr was not coming back. Is cooking in the Dallas for one of the Frenches. I got a letter yesterday from Dr Farley at Chemawa. Mr Dwin sent for him, but does not know whether he will get to stay, until they hear from Washington.

Also I got a letter from Wobega Lemo that his son  
died last Saturday in The Dalles. If Dr Doakster comes  
out here. I'll give him some different items from what  
he got at Salem & Chemawa. Perhaps you did not see  
his statements to Oregonian reporter. I'll send them  
some time. Also the rules we received regarding  
Boarding Schools etc.

I wish I could see you this morning. Its bright and  
clear here. Yesterday was windy and a little cloudy  
Day before was hot.
