Dear Mary

Your dear, sweet letter came today, the
only letter I received. I was so thankful you wrote even
though you was so tired. I should have been greatly disappointed
had it not come today. I am truly thankful you got
along so well and reached the journey's end in safety.
Some how I felt that you would. I do pray for you and
Clifford every day, most earnestly every night. There is a
comfort in it, that worldly people can never realize or
enjoy. I send the book "Green Mountain Boys" I finished it at
exactly 12 o'clock Saturday night. I also send 2 copies
"Frank Leslie's". Mrs Jackson read the Aug. No. The Sept No
came today. You will have much more time for reading
than I, and they will be better taken care of there. Yesterday
was a cool cloudy day. It looked like raining all the time
but gradually broke away, though the sun never showed
itself until just as it was about to disappear behind

the western mountains. Saturday Dr S asked me if I had
any engagement for Sunday noon. I told him no. He invited me
to take dinner with them. I told him "I could accommodate him"
He sat 12 o'clock, as I told him the Indians were so late about
getting on to meeting. She had a nice dinner, but I was not
very hungry. We had huckleberry pie, for one thing, the first
berries of the season. This I presume all came out of my letting
them have some milk as I came past wearing after milking.
They offered me tickets twice, but I refused them, until some
future time. I don't want to get too thick there. Mr Lacey
got back from Linnemorko today. Williams took on considerably
about being discharged. Said he could not because it reflected
upon his character. Said he would like to know who had
been preferring charges against him. Did not believe the Proprietor
did as he was very friendly with him. He went to Wofenmitten
last evening & took the stage for the Dalles this morning. Is
going to route to Mitchell I believe. It won't do him any good
I'm sure. There is coming down 1 "offert to take charge of the
Mission house & work, as I understand. She is in the Dalles now.
Mrs Williams expects to leave at end of this quarter, so Mrs Sampson
may get it should Mr S accept the Superintendency. I have
just read of Mr Walkers death. The firm will likely be continued
still as Staver & Walker, Mrs W being a partner. It won't do
to change a firm name so widely known. I think it will all come
around yet. At any rate whatever comes will be for the best.
